All you need is a pair of comfortable shoes</li> <li>– Walking to work or place of study takes exactly the same amount of time as you are not dependant on traffic congestion. This makes it more reliable</li> <li>– It is a nice, gentle form of exercising</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Commuting by bus or tram is quick and affordable</li> <li>– Bus lanes make getting somewhere quick even during rush hour</li> <li>– Using public transport shows environmental awareness and that you care about the planet</li> <li>– You can read or listen to the music en route</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Trains never suffer from traffic congestion, although they might be overcrowded during peak times</li> <li>– Trains always run on schedule so you can plan your day more effectively and reliably</li> <li>– Arguably, trains can be more comfortable than cars and buses as they maintain constant speed throughout the way without having to accelerate or slow down</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Probably one of the most expensive ways to commute, driving offers unmatched personal freedom</li> <li>– It is most convenient for big families with kids as they have to be taken to places like school or kindergarten</li> <li>– Some people find the process of driving a car enjoyable in itself, without going somewhere in particular</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Affordable and environmentally friendly</li> <li>– Carpooling encourages socialising and bonding with your colleagues/fellow students</li> <li>– Both driver and the passengers benefit if they chip in to pay for fuel</li> <li>– Makes the commute more fun when there are more people in the car</li> </ul>
