<p>+ Provides fundamental, in depth understanding of the subject</p> <p>+ After graduating, you are given a recognised proved of your qualification in the form of a diploma</p> <p>– Takes years to finish</p> <p>– The knowledge and information provided can become outdated or difficult to apply in real life</p> <p>– Can get very expensive, many people live paying off college loans many years after graduating</p>	<p>+ Little to no associated costs</p> <p>+ Can be done from home or anywhere else, at the time of your convenience</p> <p>+ The intensity and workload is controlled by you alone</p> <p>– Requires a great deal of self-control, motivation and self-organisation</p> <p>– No proof of qualification which can be required by your employer</p>	<p>+ Personalised approach to your studying needs</p> <p>+ Classes at time and place that are best for you</p> <p>+ Experienced guidance from a qualified specialist</p> <p>– Can be expensive</p> <p>– Just like with self-education, no proof of qualification is provided afterwards</p>	<p>+ Highly-specialised courses that target particular skills or trades</p> <p>+ Doesn't take too much time so you can start working sooner</p> <p>+ At the end of the course you are normally given a certificate or other paper that proves the fact of participation in the programme</p> <p>– The resulting qualification has limited application, usually in one or two fields</p>	<p>+ Only gives you skill and knowledge that will be directly relevant to your duties</p> <p>+ It is combined with doing work, so you don't have to lose time and money on studying</p> <p>– The knowledge that you get is very specific and can only be used for that one particular time of job</p>
